It is very important that our cohort understand the Army Force 2025 and Beyond concept, and how our senior logistics leaders envision augmenting our capability to the future force. The Army's strategy focuses on ensuring the future joint force can win in a complex world. Force 2025 improves the force's lethality, mobility, survivability, and expeditionary capabilities. In accordance with the Army operating concept (AOC), Army forces will provide the foundational capabilities required by the joint force.

These foundational capabilities include command and control, along with the ability to project power onto land, and from land across the air, maritime, space, and cyberspace domains. The Army will develop the future force collaboratively with joint commands, sister services, industry, academia, interorganizational, and multinational forces. These efforts will guide changes to Army doc-

trine, organizations, training, materiel (equipment) development, leadership and education, personnel, and facilities (DOTMLPF).

Understanding how we will align as a future force is the first step in our education process. We can do this through self education, including continued professional reading of senior strategic messages, to understand the overall mission and where we fit into it, as a cohort. The strategic message that the panel members offer is another opportunity to appreciate how senior leadership believes we align in the future force. As logisticians we must be able to understand how to employ our skills best to enhance the Army and the joint, interagency, intergovernmental and multinational environment.

I look forward to seeing our cohort in great numbers at the 45th AMM – our success will be based on your attendance, making this a paramount event. I also look at this as another forum for mentorship and improving our understanding of the future of our Army.
