- Chief of Ordnance and Commandant of the US Army Ordnance Center and Schools at Aberdeen Proving Ground
- Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics (G-4) at Headquarters, US Army Europe
- Director, Logistics Plans, Logistics Operations and Logistics Automation at Headquarters, Department of the Army

LTG (Ret) Stevenson received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from West Virginia University in 1974, a Masters of Science in Logistics Management from the Florida Institute of Technology in 1983, and graduated from the US Army War College in 1993. His awards include the Distinguished Service Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, Legion of Merit with four Oak Leaf Clusters, and Bronze Star. He is an active member of the Association of the United States Army (AUSA), and the National Defense Industrial Association (NDIA). He was inducted into the US Army Ordnance Corps Hall of Fame in 2013 for his significant contributions to the Ordnance Corps and the nation's security.
