Aside from all the tremendous work Chapters do in their communities, here are just a few of the numerous accomplishments of the USAWOA at the national level:

- The fight to stop implementation of the retiree COLA cuts passed in the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2013

- The fight to stop increases in dependent/ retiree costs associate with TRICARE, of as much as 100% in 2014 and 400% in 2014 (success was achieved) • The fight to save Senior Warrant Officer Leadership positions in the ARNG, when in 2012 the ARNG considered abolishing the CCWO position (achieved in partnership with all three components)

- The 12% combined, targeted pay raised for WO's in 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2007

- Passage of the Warrant Officer Management Act

- The achievement of Warrant Officer Aviation Incentive Pay, equivalent to that given to traditional officer aviators

- The authorization of the CW5 pay grade

- The commissioning of Chief Warrant Officers
